

HEERF II (Higher Education Emergency Relief Funds II)

As part of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA), the State College of Beauty Culture (SCBC) has applied for and received grant funds under section 314(a)(4).

1. The application process required SCBC sign and return to the Department of Education, the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that SCBC has used or intends to use the applicable amount of funds designated to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
2. To date, SCBC has received \$12,595 of its total award of \$37,785 from the Department pursuant to SCBC's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. Current eligibility and award amounts are only in affect for the initial draw down of \$12,595. Future award amounts will be based on the student population at the time funds are received from the Department of Education.
3. All grant funds received by SCBC have been disbursed to eligible students.
4. The total number of students at SCBC eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 of Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 314(a)(4) of the CRRSAA Act is 26.
5. The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to Students under Section 314(a)(4) of the CRRSAA Act is 26.
6. The Policy and methods used by SCBC to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grant to Students under Section 314(a)(4) of the CRRSAA Act is as follows:

Eligibility: Any Title IV eligible student, enrolled in a Title IV eligible program at State College of Beauty Culture (SCBC) during the eligibility period will receive their share of grant funds during the designated disbursement period. Additionally, eligible students must sign an agreement stating that they will only use the funds for the sole purpose of covering expenses related to any component of the cost of attendance or emergency costs due to coronavirus.

Eligibility Period: An eligible student must be enrolled on March 10, 2021, or scheduled to begin attending SCBC during the month of March 2021 and not on a Leave of Absence as of March 10, 2021.

Disbursement Period: Under the terms of the Certification and Agreement signed by SCBC for the above-mentioned grant funds, funds began being disbursed on March 10, 2021. SCBC administration cleared up all eligibility issues and disbursed all funds by March 24, 2021.

Disbursement Amount: Eligible students received grant amounts based on their Expected Family Contribution (EFC) as determined by completing a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Base disbursements were determined for programs of 900 hours or more in length. Eligible students enrolled in a program less than 900 hours received a prorated disbursement based on program length.

No additional HEERF II funds have been drawn down to disburse since March, 2021.
